
Educational Attainment (based on 1990 Census)

- Kaiser Foundation Hospitals report data by region. There are 14 locations in the Northern California region, including two in Sacramento county, and twelve in the Southern California region.
- Shriners Hospitals for Children offer: pediatric specialty services free of charge, and treatment of orthopedic problems, diseases of the musculoskeletal system, burns and associated disability.

The Sacramento facility offers a special program for spinal chord injuries.
- Vencor Sacramento is a general acute care hospital, specializing in treatment of comatose patients.


Net Patient Revenue per Adjusted Day





Net Patient Revenue by Payer 1999




Net Inpatient Revenue/Expense per Day

ER Visits, Sacramento County, 1999






Net Patient Services Revenue & Expense per Census Day

California Clinic Patients Race/Ethnicity 1999




Economic Status (Based on Federal Poverty Levels)

- Pregnancies/births account for 27.8% of hospital discharges in Sacramento County, and 28.3% of hospital discharges statewide.
- Circulatory system disorders, respiratory system disorders, and injuries/poisonings/complications account for the top three diagnostic categories of hospital discharges in Sacramento County, excluding pregnancies and births.

- Obstetrical procedures account for 23.1% of inpatient principal procedures performed on Sacramento County residents and 22.2% of inpatient principal procedures performed statewide.
- Principal procedures performed for digestive, cardiovascular and musculoskeletal systems are the top three procedure categories for hospital discharges in Sacramento County, excluding obstetrical and diagnostic/therapeutic procedures.



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


Types of Injuries 1999


High-risk Deliveries, % of All Deliveries

Percent of County Asthma Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group



Percent of County Cancer Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group



Percent of County HIV Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group



Percent of County Cardiac Bypass Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group





Percent of County Mastectomy Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group











Percent of County Auto Injury Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group








Drug Poisoning Hospitalizations Trends





Percent of County Drug Poisoning Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group







Percent of County Gunshot Injury Patients Compared to the Percent of Total County Population for Each Group


